Annual Report 2022-2023

Maharshi Valmiki College of Education was established in the year 1995 by the Government of NCT of Delhi as a Constituent College of University of Delhi in order to cater to the long standing need for avenues for pre-service elementary and secondary teacher education programmes to the aspiring students in Delhi. Known initially as College of Education, and housed on the Ground Floor of Bhai Parmanand Institute of Business Studies Building at Shakarpur, Delhi, the College assumed its present name MaharshiValmiki College of Education later in the year 1996 drawing inspiration from the high ideals of the great teacher Valmiki. The College conceptualized, designed and adopted its logo in the year 1999.

Making a humble beginning with Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) programme with 38 students from the Humanities and Social Science streams, the College got initiated in shaping its profile under the inspirational leadership of the philosopher, artist and teacher - late Professor R.P. Sharma, Former Head & Dean, Faculty of Education, University of Delhi, who took over the College as Officer on Special Duty on 21 Sep 1995; the day celebrated as Udbhav Diwas every year. The College was formally inaugurated by Shri Madan Lal Khurana, the then Chief Minister of Delhi, on 16 Nov 1995, the day celebrated as Foundation Day every year. After seven years of functioning from the Ground Floor of Bhai Parmanand Institute of Business Studies Building, the College moved to its present location at Geeta Colony, Delhi in the year 2003.

Having successfully shaped the lives of twenty batches of its students of the one-year B.Ed. programme in its initial twenty years, the College introduced the two-year B.Ed. programme with effect from the academic session 2015 – 16 and opted for 100 seats for the course; admissions to which are open to the aspiring graduates and postgraduates from the sciences, social sciences, languages, mathematics, and commerce streams. The admissions to the College are made on all-India basis through a Common Entrance Test conducted by the Faculty of Education, University of Delhi.

All through the twenty-seven years of its coming into being, the College has been very seriously focusing on instilling quality and bringing diversity within the scope of its

teacher education programme. Much beyond the mandatory requirements, the College dedicates itself to the mission of transforming students into teachers who are attuned to the pursuit of academic excellence, who are vibrant on cultural diversity and who are oriented to social affinity. Teachers shape the destiny of future generations. Teacher education programmes therefore, have an intensively wider role to play. The College strives hard to assume this responsibility and endeavours to do justice to it being a dedicated teacher education institution of the University of Delhi.

With many pass-outs of the College contributing their bit in the school and university systems across the length and breadth of the country, and many others channelizing themselves in diverse domains abroad, the College commits itself to an exploratory journey in teacher education with the intent of blending the much cherished ideals with the hopes and aspirations of the emerging global world.

Major Activities and Achievements:

After almost two years of online teaching due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the College reopened for offline classes with full swing. The students were excited as the College life was back on track. No doubt online and hybrid of the classes somehow compensated the regular mode but it is no alternative to offline/face to face mode of the College life.

In keeping with the spirits of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav: India@75, an international symposium was organised in college on the theme International Discussion: Gandhi in South Africa and India, Education and Yoga: Contemporary Essentials (दक्षिण अफ्रीका और भारत में गांधी, शिक्षा और योग :समकालीन अनिवार्यता(on Monday, 18 July 2022. Dr Lokesh Maharaj, senior lecturer at University of Kwazulu-Natal (South Africa) was the Chief speaker for the event. The panel was also headlined by Chief Guest Prof. Mala Mishra (Aditi Mahavidyalay, Delhi University), Special Speaker Dr Rakesh Kumar Dubey (Jamia Milia Islamia) and Prof. Ramjee Dubey (Principal, MVCoE). The esteemed panelists highlighted various key aspects of the philosophy of Mahatma Gandhi, his philosophy of education and the relevance of Yoga.

An interactive online session was organized for students as part of Phase V of the Field Observation Program on Saturday, 23 July 2022. The chief guest, Dr Ajay Choubey is an active researcher and the Head of School in the Kingsway Camp school of Delhi administration. He introduced the students to the praxis for emancipatory pedagogy through Community School and social change, and various other innovative schemes operating in Delhi Govt. schools. A question-answer round was organized wherein Dr Choubey answered the queries o students. Inter-institutional visits were scheduled for Thursday, 7 July 2022 and Friday, 8 July 2022 under Phase IV of the Field

Observation Program. Students visited CIET(NCERT) and S Dr B.R. Ambedkar National Memorial. Visit to Gandhi Darshan was organized on Friday, 16th September, 2022 B.Ed. IInd year students under EPC 3 (Practicum)- Understanding Communication. Dr. Prabhjot Kulkarni, Ex-Principal of the College conducted a workshop on "स्वयं और जीवन में विश्वास का निर्माण". A workshop on the theme "Braille Map and Script" for B. Ed second-year Year students (2022-23) was conducted on 17th April 2023. The Covid 19 pandemic having altered the conventional paradigms of the teaching learning process, the Academic Session 2020-21 started with an online Orientation programme for the B.Ed. To ensure the resumption of educational activities and discourses, the morning assembly was conducted as always but in the online mode. The School Experience Programme started with a two day online Orientation focusing on the transition into the digital classroom with appropriate pedagogical adaptations. Annual Report 2018 - 19

This is a day of joy for all of us to celebrate and 18th Foundation Day of our college

Who am I

The teacher wanted me to know, "Who am I?"

To know means to find and dig out that which is new.

What is new in me?

Is it the body that has changed its shape in feet and inches?

Is it my idea and thought that can create a story?

Is it the love and passion to become what I was not before?

A mere desire to be a little different from others in knowledge, vision and perception?

A longing to be known by the world?

Here I am a leader and a king,

I did all that was to be done to know myself.

With ardent love I offered my answer to the teacher.

She smiled with a glint in her eyes only to tell me that I had failed.

Once again she sent me back to my seat to understand, "Who am I?'

I looked at myself in the mirror

Only to see to my surprise dark patches of old nature

Like museum pieces, full of dust and dirt,

That demanded revamp, retouch and refurbish.

Not a simple task, I knew.

Still being a faithful, obedient pupil of the teacher

I took a little time to gather strength and courage

Working hard for days, weeks, months and years with patience and endurance,

Yet did not accomplish my work

So demanding, puzzling and challenging it was,

The teacher came up to me giving a pat, again smiling,

Gently this time admiring the effort and pain I had gone through.

Softly and simply she said, "Go and realise!"

I set forth on the arduous journey,

Once more to fumble and stumble in pain and agony

That kept me yet going; for I understand

Every fall has a rise

Every ray has a hope

And every prism has spectrum...

Yet could not answer my teacher with satisfying and perfect response.

Who am I after all? Am I this body only of different parts; organs, nerves, etc. Or Am I representing my impulses, emotions, feelings, desires, etc. Or 'I' means my mind, ideas, thoughts, beliefs, etc. I stand for something beyond all these three as they fail to give a true picture of our being-'I'. The true 'I' is not seen so easily, not recognised in a simple mechanical way. It is a tough task to know, understand and realise ourselves No doubt the three parts body, life (vital), mind help us in leading our lives in this world but they need to be sharpened and developed if we wish to attain success in the world. Hence we must be able to recognise our true worth or value.

Once a disciple of Guru Nanakdev asked him: "What is the value of human birth?" Before answering this question, Nanak handed over a diamond to the disciple and asked him to have it evaluated in the market to find out its price.

As instructed, the disciple took the diamond to the market and began showing it to different shopkeepers. He first went to the fruit-seller, asking him, "What shall you give me in return for this?" "I will give you three apples in exchange for this diamond," said the fruit-seller.

Next, he went to a tomato-seller and placed before him the same question." I will give you five kilos of tomatoes in exchange of the diamond," said the tomato-seller. The disciple then went to a jeweller, requesting him to appraise the diamond. After examining the diamond, the jeweller offered to him Rs. 20,000. The disciple then got the diamond evaluated by several jewellers and each offered a little more money, the maximum being Rs.50,000.

Finally, the disciple went to the most renowned and reputed jeweller in town and requested him to value its price. The jeweller placed the diamond on his palm. After examining it very closely he was struck with awe and kept gazing at it in disbelief. The jeweller finally said: "O brother, don't ever think of selling this diamond. It is priceless."

Bringing the diamond back to Guru Nanak, the disciple narrated to him his entire experience. Nanak then remarked: "Hope you now understand the value of being born as a human being." 1

I do hope that we understand intellectually or mentally the true value of life. This life or birth is a priceless gift to us; hence we should make full use of our present birth.

The greatest aim of education for centuries in India has been 'to realise oneself', to know oneself in totality as the key to supreme Truth and Light lie in this inner self, which we normally ignore to develop in our education system. We are still enslaved by Lord Macaulay's English Education resulting in gross inertia (tamas) poverty, unemployment, mediocrity. Let's now awaken ourselves Let's know who we are, why we are living what is our true purpose of life and many such similar things. In the true sense we have abandoned our 'trueself'- our own Jivatman or soul or Spirit. We, in Education have the prime duty to awaken ourselves so that our trueself or spirit rules over our body, life and mind. All purity of character, completeness of personality, integral development of individual are primarily dependent on the 'True or innerself'. What do we see around us in daily life? The news of murder, rape, robbery, violence, cunningness which we read and see are all outcome of our neglect to know and develop our innerself. There is no other way to attain success and happiness than to become aware of oneself and perfect oneself.

"Truth, purity and unselfishness whenever these are present, there is no power below or above the Sun to crush the possessor thereof. Equipped with these, one individual is able to face the whole universe in opposition."

Indian youth is at the crossroads today; they need to understand India's rich cultural and spiritual heritage which is priceless. They need to discriminate between the new materialistic culture and the growing need of a 'complete life' richly otherwise full of priceless values and virtues of goodness, compassion, truth, self confidence and fearlessness and many more. They have to awaken the sleeping soul of India through their own efforts of becoming conscious and aware citizens. How can one develop one's virtues and values? How can one become an aware citizen? Keeping in view the dire necessity of Value Education today we have amongst us Dr. S. Lakshmi, (Principal, Shaheed Rajguru College of Applied Sciences for Women) who herself leads a life of values. We would be delighted to hear from her the 18th foundation day address: 'Values in Education' after a short-while.

With your permission Sir,(Dr. Suresh Garg), I may now proceed further to present before you the Annual Report of College year 2012-2013 (till November 2013)

The academic session 2012-13 began in July 2012 with a total of 165 students out of which 160 appeared in Annual Examination of the University of Delhi in May 2013. We faced many difficulties in the year 2012 particularly in terms of the challenges that are bringing changes for betterment of the teacher education programme B.Ed. Despite all odds and difficulties our students showed brilliant performance this year. Many of them are well placed in public and government schools and some are pursuing higher studies in Delhi and outside the NCR. We are glad to see that some of our old students have come back to us as guest supervisors after finishing higher courses in Education. Some of our passed out students are serving the University of Delhi as teacher educators in Central Institute of Education, Shyama Prasad Mukherji College for Women, Gargi College, Miranda House and a few are teaching in different colleges of Delhi University viz. Vivekananda College, Deshbandhu College etc. We shall be able to provide correct facts about our students when we officially constitute Alumni Association. Dr. P.K. Sharma has been deputed to do this long pending work and very soon this will be formalised.

Maharshi Valmiki Jayanti, an annual feature was observed with silencing the mind, invocation and talk cum power-point presentation by Prof. Sunil Kumar, (Member Managing Committee, R.K. Mission, New Delhi) followed by an interactive session with students and teachers.

Prof. Sunil Kumar chose to speak on 'Change of Nature ... essential for self mastery' looking at the significance of this college which carries the name of one of the greatest teachers and whose life can inspire and influence the lives of all of us. In his talk he brought out the following points in detail:

- · Self reflection on a daily basis
- · 'Ananda- the delight is within 'Self' Ananda as our goal
- · Character building education M.K. Gandhi in the Round table conference, London, 1931.
- Education for IQ or Self Development Influence of work on mindset
- Different strategies for developing self mastery viz. Daily self introspection, making right choices, awakening the power of discrimination (vivek), practical guidance for the development of 'vivek'.
- Our real Self is Divine :Know the truth and truth shall make you free. Practise to purify and manage the mind.
- Self mastery in curriculum school and college (particularly teacher education institution)

Not much time could be devoted to discussion as such topics require a long term reading to form the basic aadhar for further discussion; one lecture / talk a year do not suffice to it.

There were a few book stalls and display / sale of art objects and learning materials on this occasion. Those who participated were physically challenged boys of Cheshire Home, Okhla, Sahmat, Centre for Peace and Spirituality, Jodo Gyan, Eklavya and Sanjay Kapoor's Kabaad se Jugad.

Udbahv Diwas (21 September 2012) (celebration took place, on January 2013 due to certain unavoidable circumstances), the birthday of college or precisely the College Day was celebrated with Dr.Vinod Raina* as the main speaker followed by a short session of questions and answers. Dr. Raina the important member of the draft committee of the RTE bill had been an activist, having revolutionary ideas in education in general and science education in particular.

In his talk Dr.Vinod Raina highlighted the much awaited right of those deprived children who share the same constitutional values and rights with any other citizen of India. He apprised the audience on the difficulties of the introduction of RTE which clearly indicates that human minds are narrow and rigid psychologically. The key points was OF Dr. Raina's talk were

- Democratic rule differs from any dynastic rule- hence democracy has to bring into the light of equality.
 Democratic values are always better than any other values of a country as there is a big role of people in general to play. They are the deciders and choosers, thus policy decisions are dependent on common masses.
- India being democratic; yet enslaved with old rigidities and past beliefs of social system

 Problem of para teachers today; growing need of quality teaching in schools and demand for more good and quality institutions for teacher education and need of committed teacher educators in the country.

Dr. Vinod Raina seemed hopeful for the betterment of School Education if RTE was implemented in the right spirit and in the right direction. In the session of questions and answers, one pertinent question was with regard to Art 19 which stops Common School System for becoming a part of RTE.

Overall the day was fruitful.

 Higher Education we need to place value education and higher ideas in Higher Education to remove inner dissatisfaction. What we need to do in higher education in colleges and institutions is introduction of the component of the self study, self knowledge, self assessment so that honesty and courage are promoted in the youth and we move towards the development of consciousness.

The question of mediocrity in education can be dealt with the help of development of consciousness. Researches or innovations in various disciplines be it science and technology do not show the perfection, they are done for competition or recognition or gain in money.

The conclusion of Dr. Sharma highlighted the need of introduction of courses in self study and knowledge and make that an integral part of our thought process if we want to bring a quality change in higher education. Know yourself. Self reflection witness to our own thoughts and their assessment, Honesty and Courage: Development of a course for youth.
