The student seminar was conducted with the objective of creating a common platform for sharing of ideas and views on basic concepts in education. This was done with a purpose to hone individual reflective responses to the context of education and to provide opportunity for clear, thoughtful, and creative organisation and articulation of ideas among student-teachers.

The student seminar began with the introduction of the theme and then respective presenters from each Section (B,C,D,A) of B.Ed. I year expressed their critical views on different sources of knowledge viz. Senses, Experience, Intuition and Feelings; Reason. They elaborated the meaning of each source of knowledge, its scope and limitations and tried to relate this to pedagogies of different disciplines.

While presenting about senses as a source of knowledge empiricism as an epistemological stance was explained. The views of empiricists like John Locke, George Berkeley and David Hume were referred to elaborate how knowledge is constructed through our senses. The way knowledge is gained through senses is similar to and different from the knowledge gained through experience was also discussed. In this context John Dewey's ideas on experience and the criteria to distinguish educative and miseducative experiences were critically looked at. These views were contrasted with Rationalism while explaining the limitations of empiricism as an epistemological doctrine. Further reason was described as a more objective and reliable source of knowledge and this idea was related to Plato's and Hegel's views on reason. The presenters also illustrated inductive and deductive ways of reasoning as a part of their presentation. The inadequacy of reason as a source of knowledge was addressed by further eliciting about the role of intuition and feelings in knowledge construction process. Intuitionism as an epistemological doctrine was well explained by referring to the concept of insight and feelings and how it is different from other theories of knowledge. The entire session of presentations was followed by an interactive dialogue among the presenters and the students in audience. The second student seminar concluded with an insightful feedback by the student mentors from B.Ed. II Year and the Faculty facilitators.
